Acquisitions:

Barbara reported the following statistics:

2006-07:

- We placed 3972 orders (up 226 from previous year)
- We received 4152 titles (up 278 from previous year)
- We received 4609 Volumes (up 735 from previous year)
- For AV we placed 186 orders (down 7 from previous year)
- We received 192 titles (down 6 from previous year)
- We received 291 volumes (up 52 from previous year)

2007-08 through October

- We have placed 480 orders
- We received 301 titles (398 volumes)
- We have ordered 101 AV materials
- We received 99 titles (108 volumes)

Ordering cut-off dates:

Encumber:

- half the endowed funds by January 14th
- all the endowed funds by March 3rd
- all the department funds by March 21st
- all funds by April 2nd

Recommendations for Reference and Big Ticket title book orders:

Only Pete has submitted anything so far. Kristine is going to review some reference sections for weeding and see if newer additions are available.

Dewey Project, review of 300's:

Almost all the Dewey books have been reviewed. We are down to the last titles to review, which include some 300's and other ranges, and they are set up on the review shelves. Librarians are encouraged to finish this project.

Dewey Books reviewed for CONStor:

Approximately 20-30 boxes (600-900 titles) of Dewey books previously were sent to CONStor, but we are no longer sending boxes there. We need to decide whether or not to withdraw those titles or reclass them LC. Librarians need to make the decision based on their liaison areas. Paul supports having them withdrawn but will reconsider all OhioLINK single titles books.

***NOTE-** Theresa was unable to attend the meeting, but reviewed the minutes. She would like us to discuss continuing to send books to CONSTor for the time being. Also, Theresa asks that liaisons do not make weeding or cataloging decisions on any books mentioned above, which are pending dispensation.

Request to add Oxford African American Studies Center:

From OhioNet, unlimited access price is \$1,100.00. The core of this database consists of previously released print sources, which are predominantly secondary in nature. It will also include essential print resources that are forthcoming. We have some of the print volumes represented in OAASC, but the website is updated much more frequently, so Pete thinks it would be better to subscribe to the on-line version. Judilynn Ryan and Randy Quaye are both interested in this database. Four libraries in OhioLINK have this database, but none in CONSORT.

Request to add Bridges: An Interdisciplinary Journal of Philosophy, Theology, History, and Science:

Tom was not present to discuss this agenda item he submitted.

Update from OhioLINK User Services Committee meeting:

Tom was not present to discuss this agenda item he submitted, but he submitted the following notes electronically:

- ABC-CLIO books have joined those from Springer and Oxford in OhioLINK's electronic book center.
- The Springer backfiles are coming.
- The deal with Cambridge for the online version of Historical Statistics is close to having enough support to purchase.
- A deal for Gale imprints is in process.
- The deal with Oxford for their remaining online book collections is in limbo. We currently have three of their collections and we are negotiating for the remaining 9 or 10 collections. There are pricing issues. The cost of the archives is prohibitive. The quote for the current and future collections was apparently dependent on OhioLINK purchasing the archives.

OH5 CD meeting, including the Religion approval plan:

- For the religion approval plan, each campus will spend \$4,000.00 each year on religion titles. This plan is different than the SLIP plan. The approval plan involves setting up a profile, and titles will be sent based on this profile.
- CONSTor lease will expire in 2010. Consultants recommended we end the lease. Directors may ask for another five-year lease to review CONSTor materials. OH5 libraries are weeding JSTOR titles already.
- OH5 libraries are discontinuing JSTOR library of record program, as well as the last copy in OH5 libraries policy. Instead, the new policy revolves around the last copy in OhioLINK.
- There is a CONSORT gov docs project whereby the CONSORT schools are amassing one collection with little to no duplication.
- Denison and Kenyon are creating a "floating" collection.

Other Business:

The idea of having a circulating reference collection was brought up at ALAO. This topic should be discussed at the next RILO meeting.
